DEFINITION	The Sea Life Trust Beluga Whale Sanctuary is the home of the world’s first Beluga whale sanctuary. Along with our two resident belugas the team also cares for a local species aquarium and several rehabilitated puffins. This position assists the curator in development of training and protocol to ensure the highest quality of welfare for all of the sanctuary residents. This role will require an individual with a strong background in positive reinforcement training with cetaceans and other species of animals. The individual should have an understanding of implementing enrichment programs with multiple species of animals.

<p>Overview</p> <p>Assists the curator in development of training and welfare protocol to ensure sanctuary residents (beluga whales) acclimate and thrive in an open water facility. Training of specific behaviours for the whales as well as development of team members to work at the highest level of animal welfare and training</p>

Beluga whale experience preferred • Experience in a leadership and/or management role with staff and/or volunteers/interns. • Valid driver’s license and clean driving record • Willingness to work outside normal business hours including weekends and holidays • Excellent written and verbal communications skills • Advanced knowledge in working in behavioural training theory and application with a focus on positive reinforcement • Experience applying a high level of animal welfare including but not exclusively to the development of appropriate enrichment program and implementation • Fluent in English <p>Other Requirements</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Knowledge of the habits and hazards of working with large marine mammals; willingness to work with some physical risk while observing proper safety precautions • Ability to work on a boat and in open water. • Open water dive certification or higher. • Must complete background check, physical examination and open water swim test. • Experience with public speaking. <p>Experience and Qualities Preferred</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bachelor’s degree in zoology, biology or a related field.
